# Why fundraise for Give A Lunch?

Fundraising for Give A Lunch is a powerful way to make a direct difference in children's lives.

Thousands of pupils across the UK go without a proper meal each school day, and with a single lunch costing around £2.70, many families struggle to afford the full £513 needed for a school year.

By raising funds for Give A Lunch, you're helping to provide nutritious, stigma-free meals to children who need them most.

Beyond the vital impact on young lives, fundraising also brings people together — uniting schools, workplaces, and communities in the shared belief that no child should go hungry at school.

# **Events for schools**

#### **Lunchtime Talent Show**



Host a mini talent show where students can perform for their peers during lunch. Sell tickets for a small donation, and invite staff judges for extra fun.

# "Give Up a Treat" Week



Encourage students and families to skip a daily treat (like a coffee, snack, or takeaway) and donate the saved money to Give A Lunch instead. It's a great way to show how small sacrifices can make a big difference.

## **Class Charity Competition**



Turn fundraising into friendly competition! Each class or year group works to raise the most money — through collections, stalls, or creative ideas — with a small prize for the winners.



# **Events for schools**

#### **Non-Uniform Day**



Ask pupils and staff to donate £1–£2 to come to school in casual clothes or a fun theme — like Superhero Day, Pyjama Day, or Decades Day. It's easy to organise and always a favourite!

#### **Bake Sale or Snack Stall**



Encourage students, parents, and teachers to bake cakes, biscuits, or healthy snacks to sell at break or lunchtime. You can even tie it to a "Healthy Lunch" theme to match Give A Lunch's mission.

### **Sponsored Challenge**



Get pupils moving for a cause — a sponsored walk, run, or "laps around the playground" challenge. Students collect pledges for each lap completed, promoting fitness while raising funds.



# **Skydive for Give A Lunch**


Take the ultimate leap with skydiving for Give A Lunch and turn adrenaline into impact.

# **Events for the family**

#### **Sponsored Walk or Cycle**



Plan a family-friendly walk, bike ride, or hike and ask friends and relatives to sponsor each mile or kilometer. It's active, healthy, and fun for all ages.

#### **Car Boot Sale**



Declutter together! Families can sort toys, books, games, or clothes and sell them in a mini garden sale or car boot event. Proceeds go directly to Give A Lunch.

### Seasonal or Holiday Event



Tie your fundraising to a holiday or season, such as a Halloween costume parade, Easter egg hunt, or Christmas craft fair. Families can invite friends and neighbours, charging a small entry fee or donation for activities.



# **Events for children at home**

#### **Bake Sale at Home**



Children can make lemonade, cookies, cupcakes, or other treats to sell to family, neighbours, or friends. Even a small garden stall can raise a surprising amount!

# **Sponsored Activities**



Children can choose an activity to do at home for sponsorship — for example reading a certain number of books in a month or completing a puzzle or creative challenge

Friends and family can pledge money for each milestone achieved.

## "Give It Up" Challenge



Kids can take on a challenge to give up something for a set time like sweets, screen time, or a favourite snack — and ask family and friends to sponsor their effort.



# Run for Give A Lunch

Strap on your running shoes, lace up and get ready to make a difference. When you choose to run for Give A Lunch, you're turning every mile into a meal — raising vital funds to ensure children don't go hungry at school.
